

VISION ZERO & THE SAFE SYSTEM APPROACH




VISION ZERO

- A strategy supported by policies to eliminate traffic <u>fatalities and serious</u> <u>injuries</u>.
- Began in the 1990s in Sweden

SAFE SYSTEM APPROACH


- A plan to prevent all injuries and fatalities
- A safer road system: planned, designed, operated
- Shared Responsibility






REVIEW OF MUNICIPAL ROAD SAFETY PROGRAMS

- Update design guidelines considering safety factors






RECOMMENDATIONS AND ACTION PLAN

- Create an action plan for all road users






PERFORMANCE METRICS AND MONITORING
